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- **2014**
 - Need for digitalised up-to-date infectiology guidelines identified.
 - No agreement with Antimicrobial Therapy Inc., collaboration halted.
 - Decision for BVIKM-SBIMC to act as editor of its own guidelines,
 - Dutch and French version.
 - 1 FTE.
- **2014 – 2017: preparatory work (± 50 MDs and pharmacists involved and scientific bodies).**
- **November 2017: IGGI launch.**

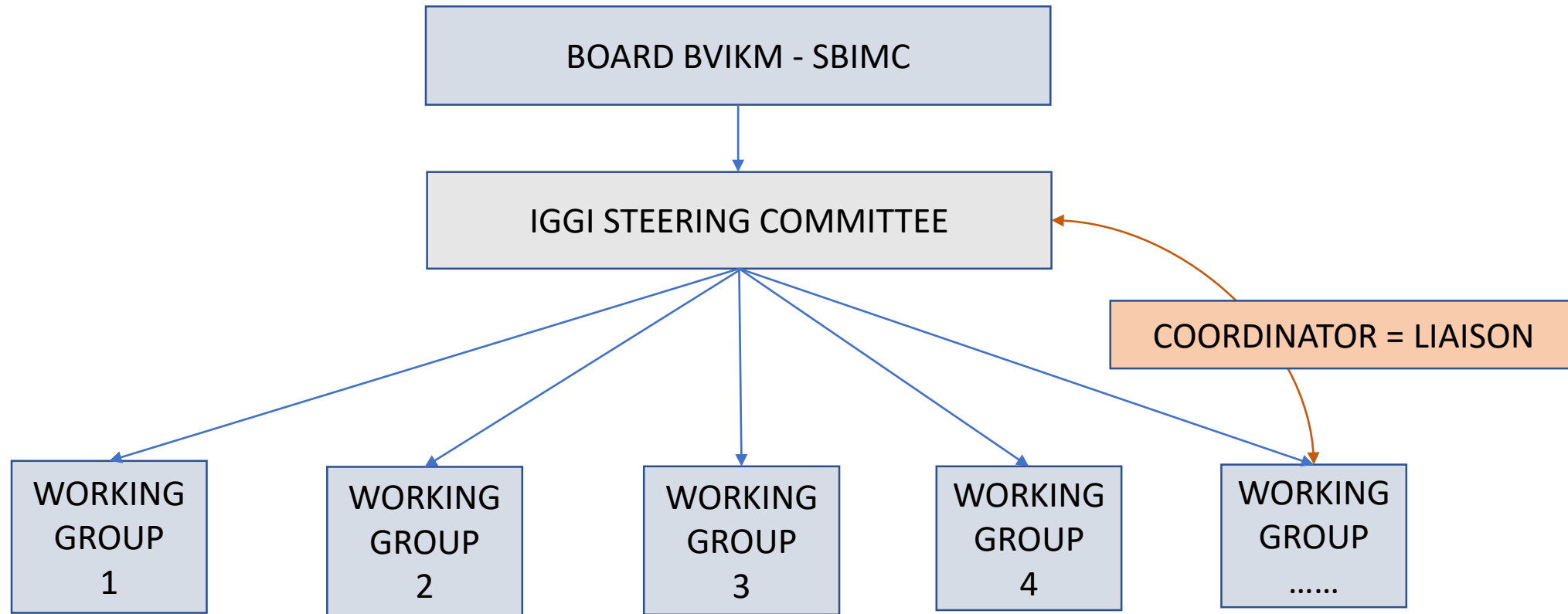
- Prevention and treatment of:

- Stepwise review of all current contents, starting with:

 - Sepsis (TBD).
 - Penicillin allergy and desensitisation (TBD).
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- Addition of new content.

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WORKING GROUPS

- Balanced mixture of (clinicians), microbiologists, at least 1 paediatrician.
- If relevant, a clinical pharmacist, other specialists and a general practitioner will be invited to participate in the activities of the group.
- As the working group will also be responsible for delivering a correct (from a linguistic point of view) text in Dutch and in French, the group must be composed of both native French and Dutch speakers.
- Gender must be taken into account.
- It is considered important that young colleagues be invited to participate in the activities of the working groups.

WORKING PRINCIPLES

- IGGI is not a textbook on infectiology, the content should be concise and presented in bullet points. The files should be as easy to read and as userfriendly as possible.
- The content of the reviewed files will be intended for the clinician non infectiologist implying that the information should be relevant and understandable for this group of professionals and not dive into the smallest details or deal with very exceptional clinical cases.
- The review of the content will be based on new relevant data: publications, guidelines, availability of anti-infectives, most recent resistance data, new techniques,
- For as far possible, validated guidelines edited by other Belgian scientific bodies will be taken into account and/or referred to. The same applies to best practices implemented in Belgian hospitals,
- Each working group defines its own ways of working.

TIMELINE

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- → **November 2018**: creation of steering committee, definition of working groups, selection of chapters to be reviewed,
- **November 22nd 2018**: symposium BVIKM-SBIMC, plan presentation, call for collaborators,
- → **December 2018**: composition of working groups, 1st meeting.
- **January → August 2019**: reviewing process.
- **September 2019**: prefinalisation of reviewed chapters, selection of chapters for the coming year, nomination of working group coordinators, ...
- **October 2019**: extra BVIKM-SBIMC symposium on reviewed chapters, group discussions, amendments,
- **November 2019**: process finalised, launch of new working year.
